
ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES (ACES)

- Potentially traumatic experiences that occur in childhood (age 0-17)
- Linked to chronic health problems, mental illness, and substance misuse in adulthood
- Also potentially education and job opportunities negatively

ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES

• Preventing ACES could reduce a large number of health conditions:

 - Mental Illness in the household
 - Parental separation or divorce
 - Incarcerated household member




ACES IN SOUTH DAKOTA ADULTS


ACE SCORES, BRFSS 2017 & 2018



DEMOGRAPHICS OF THOSE WITH AN ACE SCORE OF FOUR OR MORE





DEMOGRAPHICS OF THOSE WITH AN ACE SCORE OF FOUR OR MORE




HEALTH RISK FACTORS

PREVALENCE OF SELECTED HEALTH RISK FACTORS BY ACE SCORE GROUP






PREVALENCE OF SELECTED HEALTH RISK FACTORS BY ACE SCORE GROUP




CHRONIC DISEASE

PREVALENCE OF SELECTED CHRONIC DISEASE BY ACE SCORE GROUP




PREVALENCE OF SELECTED CHRONIC DISEASE BY ACE SCORE GROUP

CONCLUSION

- South Dakota has similar ACE rates as other states
- Significant differences exist between age, race, and income categories
- Differences were seen by ACE category select risk factor categories
- No significant differences were seen among Chronic Disease

WHAT CAN STATES AND COMMUNITIES DO

- Improve access to high-quality childcare by expanding eligibility, activities offered, and family involvement.
- Use effective social and economic supports that address financial hardship and other conditions that put families at risk for ACEs.
- Enhance connections to caring adults and increase parents' and youth skills to manage emotions and conflicts using approaches in schools and other settings.
- Recognize challenges that families face and offer support and encouragement to reduce stress
