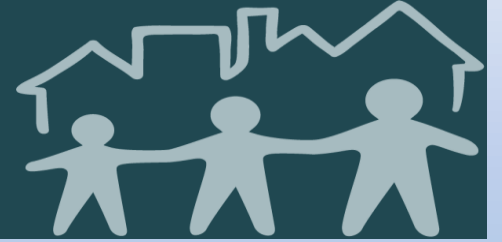
# Our Vision

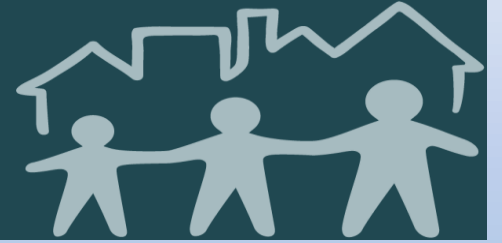
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# Brown County Timeline



- **January 2020-** Brown County stakeholders met identified gaps in services related to mental health & substance use for adolescents.
- **Spring 2020-** Applied for pilot of CTC in South Dakota.
- **Summer 2020-** Coordinator Jordan Mounnga hired and completed facilitator training.
- **Fall/Winter 2020-** Core team of six oriented and began recruitment.
- **Spring 2021-** 34 stakeholders attended Key Leader Orientation virtually.
- **Summer 2021-** 27 participated in Community Board Orientation and formed six workgroups.
- **Fall 2021-** Youth Survey to be conducted in local schools.

# Successes & Challenges



- Formation of workgroups
- Data collection participation from local agencies
- Continued recruitment of community board members
- Marketing & development of identity in the community
- Participation in youth survey among schools, hesitancy with active consent law.
- Implementing KLO virtually versus in-person.
