The Problem & Our Purpose:

- **16.2%** of Rapid City residents had an income below poverty level in 2019.
- During the 2020-21 academic year, 591 kids were identified as homeless in Rapid City Area Schools.
- The average monthly income for a full-time, minimum wage earner is \$1,725, while average monthly rent in Rapid City, pre-COVID, was \$826.
- OneHeart's Purpose: To eliminate or mitigate as many barriers as possible that prevent people from escaping a life in the crisis of poverty and create a workforce development program unlike any other





OneHeart's Mission: *To create pathways out of poverty for those desiring to thrive.*

We provide:

- Transitional supportive living units for program enrollees (with 24/7 security)
- Food
- Transportation
- Workforce Development
- Co-location of partnering agencies who provide numerous support services:
 - Childcare
 - Life Skills
 - Job skills
 - Educational opportunities
 - Urgent care services
 - Mental/behavioral health counseling
 - Family support



A single mom was referred to OneHeart by the *local domestic violence shelter, where she sought* help after leaving an abusive relationship. She was employed, but not in a full-time position. On campus this guest received food, shelter, and *support from OneHeart, counseling for her* trauma, and childcare and occupational therapy for her son through partnering agencies. Her OneHeart care coordinator served as the point person for the team of people supporting her through her journey. When she graduated from OneHeart, she had a place to live, a full-time job, a savings account for the first time in her life, and a consistent childcare provider.
